The University of Melbourne

The University offers a graduate pathway into Social Work.

Master of Social Work: 2-years, Parkville, <https://bit.ly/2J7yDDs>

Selection Criteria:

- academic performance in an undergraduate degree with at least one year of full-time studies in social sciences or equivalent.
- satisfy the English language requirements for postgraduate courses.
- evidence of relevant paid or volunteer work experience of at least 40 hours over a 3 month duration.
- a personal statement of up to 500 words outlining why they wish to be considered for the course; and
- nomination of a professional referee.

“This is one of the first masters degrees accredited nationally by the Australian Association of Social Workers (AASW). A masters degree in social work is a portable qualification, enabling you to work locally, nationally or internationally.

Bachelor of Human Services/Master of Social Work: 4-years, <https://bit.ly/2ldTILx>

Indicative ATARs: Melbourne – 52.45, Bendigo – 67.25, Albury-Wodonga – 53.05. Mildura and Shepparton – no ATAR published.

Prerequisites: minimum study score of 30 in English (EAL) or 25 in any other English.

“This qualifying social work course will provide you with the skills and knowledge to improve outcomes for individuals, groups and communities through direct practice, community development, developing social policy initiatives, research and evaluation.

Your first year will consist of three interdisciplinary subjects, psychology, sociology and two social work subjects. In second year you'll look at social work theories and develop an understanding of community service organisations and the needs of individuals, families and groups.

A crucial part of the course is our social work field placement program. Under the supervision of an experienced social worker, you'll complete a minimum of two 70-day placements, allowing you to put many of the skills you've acquired during first and second years into practice.

During your third and fourth years you'll focus on the development of inter-personal skills, community development practice, and research and program evaluation recognising the impact of structural features such as class, gender and race.”

Academic performance in an undergraduate degree preferably with studies in arts, social sciences, psychology, teaching, business, or nursing.

Prerequisite: minimum study score of 30 in English (EAL) or 25 in any other English.

Selection Criteria:

To be eligible for admission, you'll need to have:

- an Australian undergraduate degree (or equivalent) with at least a credit (60%) average and
- completed two units in the study of society (as required by the Australian Association of Social Workers)
- past academic standing is also a significant factor in selection.

Units fulfilling the prerequisite studies of society are broadly assessed and include units such as studies in sociology, social science, social psychology, human development, anthropology, philosophy, history, gender, law, politics, media, the arts, technology, and multicultural society.

“This course prepares graduates for careers as professionally qualified social workers.

The course includes studies in theory, skills development and supervised professional practice, and opportunities for group-based learning, community engagement, practice research and integration of social work theory and practice.

Theoretical content builds on knowledge acquired by graduates in previous higher education, while social work skills components and professional practice introduce students to contemporary social work practice.

The course is accredited by the Australian Association of Social Workers (AASW), including 1000 hours of supervised professional practice.

Indicative ATAR: The ATAR wasn't used in the selection process for the 2019 intake.

Prerequisite: minimum study score of 25 in English (EAL) or 20 in any other English.

Selection Criteria:

- Academic performance in a Bachelor degree that includes at least one year of full time studies in social sciences (or equivalent)
- CV
- Personal statement
- Meet inherent requirements.
